Independence Heritage Museum is Hosting Oregon Historical Society Traveling Exhibit *Places by the Sea*, from August 1 to September 30, 2022

Independence, OR – August 2, 2022 – For the next two months, the Independence Heritage Museum will host the Oregon Historical Society's traveling exhibit <u>Places by the Sea.</u> In 1910, going to Oregon's places by the sea wasn't an easy trip. Trunks were pulled down from the attic, bathing suits aired and repaired. Bed linens, clothing, and toys were packed. The adventure was at least a week long and it could last all summer.

At the coast, enthusiastic vacationers pursued many activities. Families searched for and feasted on plentiful crabs, clams, and shellfish. It was fun to play in the sand and sea, even in Oregon's chilly coastal waters. Less hardy souls swam in warmed sea water at local natatoriums (swimming pools). Some folks strolled the boardwalks, sauntered along promenades, skipped in sand, or became lost in a good book. It was vacation time.

The <u>Places by the Sea</u> traveling exhibit is a photographic display showing the Oregon coast as a place of bustling activity and as a place of solitude. The photos, taken between 1906 and 1920, come from an album commissioned by the SP&S (Spokane, Portland & Seattle) Railway to promote Oregon's coastal beauty and ease of rail travel.

The postcard messages accompanying the photographs are small fictions, inspired by coastal postcards found in the OHS collections.
